## Window Blamed in 'Cycle, Death of Woman

A 70-year-old woman was killed here Thursday when a window apparently fell and struck her in the back of the head.

Police said Mabel Gooding was found dead about 5:30 p.m. at 22521 Redbeam Ave.

The dead woman was found by Mrs. Lee Gooding, her daughter-in-law, when she returned home from work. The elder Mrs. Gooding was slumped across the window sill and the window was resting on the back of her neck, police reported.

Officers investigating the death said the elderly woman had apparently locked herself out of the house when she went outside to hang up some laundry and was trapped when she tried to crawl through the window. Her house keys were found in the living room, officers said.

The younger Mrs. Gooding said she had called home during the day, but was not alarmed when she got no answer because her mother-in-law had said she might visit a friend.

Officers said the window was "extremely heavy" and capable of a fatal blow to a "woman as old as the victim."

Mrs. Gooding's body was removed to the Stone and Myers Mortuary.
