County supervisors, on the motion of Board Chairman Burton W. Chace, adjourned their meeting yesterday in honor of Eihan R. Haslage, former manager of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce. Haslage, of 2214 W. 243rd St., died Tuesday in a Torrance hospital.

"Mr. Haslage was one of the key supporters of the incorporation of the city of Lomita," Chace said. "His memorial scroll will be sent to work on this project and in other civic endeavors will leave a lasting tribute in his community."

Haslage served the Lomita Chamber of Commerce for more than two years. He was a member of the Torrance Elks Lodge 1948, the Torrance American Legion Post 170, the Torrance Post 40 and 8, and a past member of the American Legion Post 355 of South Gate.
