TO MEET NEEDS

Crude Oil Production Must Double in Decade

In 1859 Edwin Drake drilled the first commercial oil well the world had ever seen. Since this event, the petroleum industry has grown to be one of the significant industries, responsible for co-products as plastics, cosmetics, detergents, drugs, petrochemicals, and hundreds of other products.

In spite of the fact that there are some 600,000 oil wells scattered through the United States, the U. S. production of crude oil accounts for less than 70 per cent of the market requirement. Growing demands for petroleum and its by-products are escalating refinery demands for crude oil wells above the current estimates.

To the investor, the outcome of this trend over the next 10 years is important as free world demand should increase greatly. Reliable sources estimate that crude oil production will have to increase from 50 to 100 per cent. The next decade should be a period of unsurpassed production and consumption spurred by technological advances.

COMPANIES with interesting potential in expansion are the international companies which have experience with the foreign governments, as well as international processing, production and exploration. Along with the international, the domestic oil companies are also improving their position.

In the past, investor interest evaporated, but the general performance of the oils

in the market has shown that renewed investor interest is emerging. Companies are predicting an increase in earnings and production which warrant higher price earnings-ratios over the years. I believe selective purchases of oil and oil-related equities may be programmed as part of the growth oriented portfolios.
