Successful bidders for \$15 improvements recently conmillion in County Flood Constructed under county permit by the owners of the adjacent bonds has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Winning offer for purchase of the bonds authorized in 1958 was submitted by Chase.
Manhattan Bank. The interest rate was 3.88 per cent with a total of four bids unsealed during the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors.
Chace said that funds derived from the sale when addred to present cash and investment balances remaining from earlier offerings will finance construction of projects through the spring of 1967.

The new sales brings the total of bonds purchased to finance the program exproved by County voters in 1958 to \$210 million.
Total authorization was for \$225 million and the last block of \$15 million is expected to be sold next spring. Chace said.
