

Auto Registrations Mailed to 12 Million

Owners of 12 million vehicles licensed for operation on California streets and highways in 1966 will receive reminders this week that 1967 registration will be due early in the New Year.

The electronically processed renewal statements were mailed Tuesday for delivery throughout the state.

"California motorists are thoroughly familiar with the procedure required by state law," Tom Bright, Director of Motor Vehicles, commented in Sacramento today. "Modern automation makes it possible for the Department of Motor Vehicles to handle the applications and account for the fees paid by vehicle owners in the first month of every new year. The state maintains 146 permanent DMV field offices in convenient locations to assist people in keeping their vehicle registrations in good order promptly, without incurring penalties for tardy compliance with the law."

HE NOTED that the state has been receiving a most important contribution of public service from some 150 banks in metropolitan areas, where DMV clerks are given space for the renewal period to handle the pre-punched statement cards, and accept fees, in the simple renewal transactions only.

Auto associations and clubs also carry a large share of this work by renewing registrations for their members. And finally those motorists who prefer to accept the

moderate delay entailed in mailing their fees and applications to Sacramento, to the address shown on the back of the statements, may employ the U. S. mail.

THE DIRECTOR again emphasized the special convenience of submitting the fees in person, including a check of the registration record, and on payment of fees the immediate receipt of a valid

dated stub as the 1967 registration card, and a blue sticker designed for display on current license plates in 1967.

Bright said the fall of holidays and weekends in 1967 makes it necessary to start a day late and run the renewal eligibility period later than usual. "The official opening of the renewal period in our field offices is at the start of business, 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 3, due to the fact that

the Monday, Jan. 2, is a holiday. The service will officially end at close of business on Monday, Feb. 6. Applications received after that date will be delinquent, and subject to penalty as set forth in the law."

Field offices will maintain office hours from 8 to noon on all Saturdays between Jan. 3 and Feb. 6. The special driver licensing service offered in some metropolitan areas after 5 p.m. on one or two days a week, will be temporarily interrupted during the renewal period.

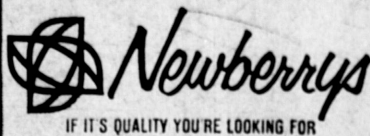
