Traffic Deaths Decrease

SACRAMENTO—The California Highway Patrol reported that July became the fourth consecutive month this year in which there was a decrease in the traffic death toll from last year.

For the first seven months of this year, a total of 2,602 persons have been killed, the CHP said, which is 70 less than for the same period of 1966.

During July, the toll from highway accidents was 435, a decrease of seven from a year ago. In areas patrolled by the CHP, there was 273 persons killed in July, an increase of 24 when compared with the average for the preceding 12 months.

The patrol made a total of 159,491 arrests in July, up 17.3 per cent from a year ago. Total arrests for the January-July period were 1,099,542, a gain from 937,180 for that period a year ago.

The jump in the number of arrests was especially noticeable for drunk driving violations. There were 3,012 arrests for drunk driving in July, up 43.4 per cent from a year ago. It brought to a total of 14,009 the drunk driving arrests this year, up 52.8 per cent from 1966.
