

County Supervisors Honor Memory of USC Professor

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors adjourned yesterday in memory of Dr. John W. Reith, 53, well-known University of Southern California professor, on motion of Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Dr. Reith was professor of geography and head of that department at USC. A resident of Harbor City, Dr. Reith died at Mount Sinai Hospital Aug. 9, following a long illness.

He joined the USC faculty in 1948 and was both an au-

thor and lecturer. During 1941-42 he was a junior assistant librarian at the Library of Congress and in 1942 began a four-year term of service in the U. S. Army.

Dr. Reith is survived by his widow, Lillian; a son, John; and a daughter, G. Helen Reith.

Memorial contributions may be made to the American Cancer Society for research. The Reich family resides at 981 Koleeta Drive, Harbor City.

Resurfacing Under Way

Veterans Must File Early For Educational Benefits

Veterans planning to attend schools and colleges this fall under the new GI bill are urged to apply early to the VA for certificates of eligibility, according to Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California regional office.

Each veteran must have this document as proof of eligibility. It is presented to the school or college upon enrollment. A claim number is also assigned for use in future correspondence with the VA.

Eligible veterans may attend college, high school, trade schools, or take correspondence courses, and receive a monthly check from the VA under the new GI bill. Applications and information may be obtained by writing, telephoning or visiting any VA office, Webster said.

VA's Southern California Regional office is located at Sepulveda and Wilshire boulevards.
