Teachers Return To School First

Returning to Torrance schools six days early will be 200 new teachers who will begin their preparations for the 1967-68 school year at a series of orientation meetings Thursday and Friday, Sept. 7 and 8.

On Monday, Sept. 11, approximately 1,000 returning teachers will join the new comers for two days of intensive preparations before classes resume.

During orientation sessions, principals will explain school procedures and policies to the new teachers and will arrange for them to tour the district's Educational Materials Building.

Speaker at the meeting of new elementary teachers Friday at 11 a.m. at West High School will be Dr. Lloyd G. Jones, curriculum consultant, who will meet with new high school teachers the same day.

Highlighting events for new teachers will be a tea to be hosted by Torrance Council, PTA, Thursday at 3 p.m.

When the rest of the teachers return, they will get classrooms ready for students, attend special meetings, and

participate in additional orientation sessions.

Featured session will be a general meeting to be held at 10:30 a.m. Monday at West High School. Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, will discuss the topic "Indicators of Quality."

A recognition breakfast for personnel who have just completed 10 and 20 years of service in the district will take place at South High School cafeteria at 8 a.m. Tuesday.

Special meetings will be held for kindergarten teachers, elementary industrial arts teachers, remedial reading teachers, new seventh and eighth grade mathematics teachers, elementary vocal music teachers, seventh and eighth grade Spanish teachers, and special service personnel.
