

Air-Vent Wins Top Fair Award

Imagine an aluminum patio cover 20 feet wide and stretching from Los Angeles to New York City.

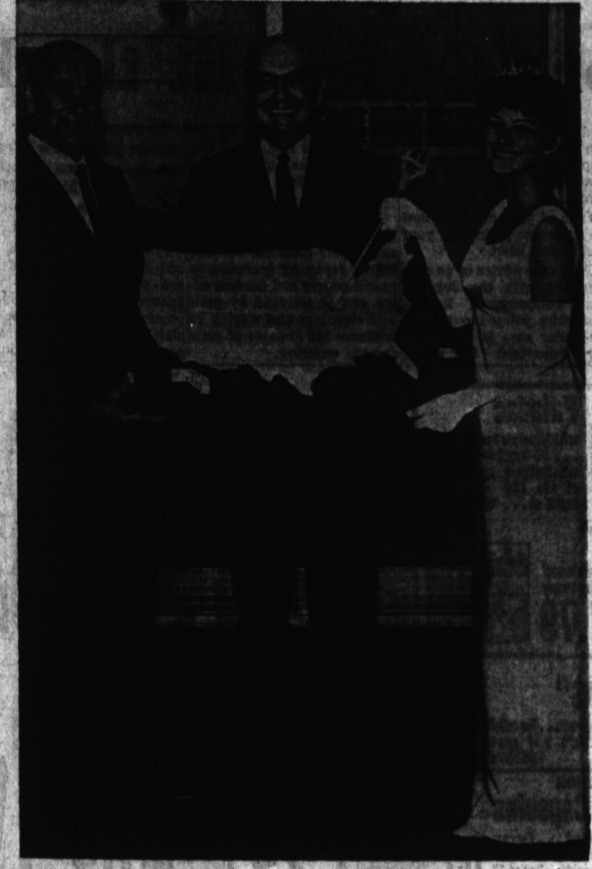
That patio cover would weigh about 100 million pounds—the equivalent of the aluminum used by the Air-Vent Aluminum Awning Co. since its founding in 1947.

The company has been awarded the Los Angeles County Fair Grand Prize in recognition of its use of 100 million pounds of aluminum and in recognition of its outstanding achievements in the design and construction of patio covers and awnings.

Olin H. Stapp, president and founder of Air-Vent, received the award from Omar Skiver, an executive of Amax Aluminum.

Air-Vent, which began with a small Los Angeles factory in 1947, now has manufacturing facilities in Chino and Hayward, Calif., Honolulu, Houston, Dallas, and Oklahoma City. Executive offices are located in Los Angeles.

To celebrate its 20 years in business, the firm has built a special exhibit in the Home Show Building at the Los Angeles County Fair. Featuring its complete product line, the exhibit also incorporates outdoor gas lighting by the Southern California Gas Co. and Ozite indoor-outdoor carpeting.

State Commission Acts On Underground Wiring

SACRAMENTO—An important move in the campaign to put public utility wiring underground was made today by the state Public Utilities Commission, which adopted a policy of undergrounding overhead wiring.

TRW Group Contributes To Hospital

The equipment purchased will be used in the hemodialysis treatment of patients. Hemodialysis, a procedure which cleanses the blood by circulation through an artificial kidney, is used to treat kidney diseases and cases of poisoning or drug overdose.

established a framework of rules to carry out the campaign after a lengthy study of both the economic and aesthetics of burying the wiring. The commission issued rules, which the utilities must file with it concerning service connections, trenching and backfill work are to be done at the property owner's expense while the utility will pay for cable up to 100 feet.

IT LEFT the matter of installing underground distribution in new residential tracts for later decision, with present rules remaining in effect.

The commission said communication utilities generally agreed to convert to underground. The findings were that there is little or no difference between overhead and underground installations as far as cost is concerned.

NO INCREASES in rates will occur in the foreseeable future as a result of the undergrounding order, the commission said.

Some 200 cities have adopted ordinances for undergrounding, and the commis-

order to meet the tremendous growth and changing needs of Los Angeles County, supervisors are continually working for better highways. In 1940, foreseeing the necessity of a well-planned highway system to adequately serve this vast area, the board adopted a Master Plan of Highways for Los Angeles County, developed by the County's Regional Planning Commission.

THIS MASTER Plan provides the basis for developing the network of major and secondary highways existing today. The Master Plan of Highways provides the people of the county with a modern, well-integrated transportation system that is coordinated with and complements the state highway and freeway system.

Throughout the years, this Master Plan has been kept up to date and improved through the cooperative efforts of the county and its cities.

In citing Los Angeles County's progressive road-building program, the Supervisor points to the current record-breaking \$94,276,000 budget for highway construction projects.

FIFTY-FIVE per cent of this money is earmarked for construction on the approximately 1,600 miles of Master Plan Highways within the unincorporated areas of the county, with the remainder of this fund allocated for use on major city streets within the 76 incorporated cities of the county.

"Los Angeles County, with an area of more than 4,000 square miles and 18,000 miles of roadways, has nearly one car registration for every two people," he said. "Our highway construction program is geared to the record-breaking county growth in both the number of vehicles and the number of miles being driven."
