

Cityhood Vote Assured - - -An election on the proposed incorporation of the Carson-Dominguez area has been virtually as-sured following a report yesterday to the Los An-geles Board of Supervisors. Petitions seeking to incorporate the area were signed by 5,965 persons --25.3 per cent of the land owners within the pro-posed boundaries, James S. Mize, clerk of the Board of Supervisors, said. The signatures repre-sent 41.3 per cent of the assessed valuation of the area, Mize added. Supervisors set Oct. 25 at 10 a.m. for a boundary and protest hearing. At least 51 per cent of the land owners in the area would have to file written protests in order to halt an election at this point.


