

Mail Notices for Income Tax; Cigarette Taxes Up

SACRAMENTO—Cigarette smokers in California will be enjoying it less today and 360,000 of the higher salary earners will not be jumping for joy with notices now be-

ing mailed to them by the state board of equalization. The state's cigarette tax, which had been 3 cents per package since its inception in 1950, jumped to 7 cents Aug. 1, with approval of Governor Ronald Reagan's huge tax increase bill.

But the tax on smokers goes to a full 10 cents a package today. The delay on the last 3 cents, which goes to cities and counties, was put into the legislation to give cities and counties the time to eliminate local taxes they might have on cigarettes.

THE STATE Board of Equal-

ization mailed floor stock returns to 107,470 cigarette dealers in California this week. This is for payment of the additional taxes on cigarettes already on hand.

It is estimated the 3-cent tax increase will produce \$49 million during the rest of the current fiscal year, and \$72 million a year afterwards.

Meanwhile, the state franchise tax board also mailed notices to 360,000 taxpayers who paid more than \$200 in state income taxes for 1966. The notice is for the required payment of half of the amount of the 1966 tax by Oct. 31.

WHILE THE boost in the cigarette tax is automatic and smokers will pay this much or more when they buy cigarettes at the store or from vending machines, the pre-payment of income taxes is provided for non-payment.

The penalty, in fact, is 10 per cent of the tax due, plus interest of 1/2 per cent per month on the tax due, plus the penalty.

Unfortunately, the payment of half the 1967 tax during October will not pay half of the taxes which will be due April 15 of 1968. In fact, the

pre-payment probably will double for the higher bracket.

THE BOARD said taxpayers who estimate their 1967 income will be down substantially from 1966 may amend the return and send in less money. Those who know their income will be higher in 1967 may send in more money, although this is not required.

The notice of pre-payment of taxes due will not include any means of computing 1967 taxes. Unless a person is quite familiar with the new tax bill, he would have no accurate idea of what his tax

liability would be during this year.

The pre-payment of taxes for the higher bracket taxpayers was accepted as a substitute for a payroll withholding of income taxes, to which Governor Reagan has been opposed. It will provide revenues for the state's general fund in October, designed to help it through the normally dry-revenue period during the last couple of months of the year.

In 1968, the October pre-payment notices will be mailed only to taxpayers who paid \$400 or more in taxes for 1967.
