Exotic Tropical Fish Will Try Museum Swim

The Harbor Aquarium Society of the Harbor and South Bay areas will open its 13th Annual Aquarium Show Friday. The show will be held at the Cabrillo Beach Marine Museum, San Pedro, Oct. 6 through 8, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily.

The Department of Recreation and Parks of the City of Los Angeles is sponsoring the free public show.

On display will be aquariums of all shapes and sizes containing many types of tropical fish ranging in size from the tiny Neon Tetras to a large electric catfish. There will be some rare fish as well as the old favorites such as guppies.

During the three-day exhibit, the museum will house one of the world's largest col-

lections of shells, birds, and fish. On the second floor of the museum, those attending the show will see relics of seafaring days, including artifacts from early San Pedro. Many ship models and information about the great sailing vessels of the world will also be displayed.

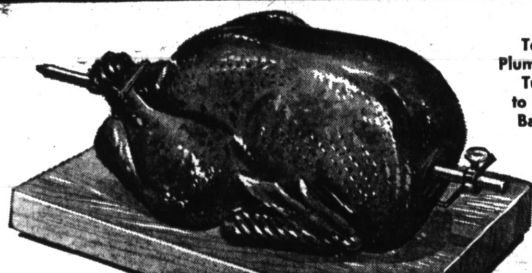

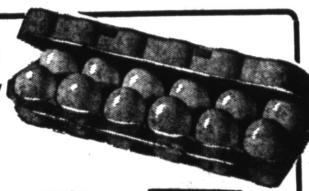
