Mexico is very stiff about cars entering. If you bring one in, you must bring one out. The couple driving out should have the car put on their tourist card. If it is not on the other tourist cards, that couple won't be allowed to leave without the car. (You CAN change the papers. But the border while it's easy.) It will take days. So do it at If you blow a tire, save it. They want to see you take EVERYTHING out with the car. . . . what we need in vaccination or shots?" They told me at the border that the U.S. no longer requires the smallpox vaccination certificate to come back from Mexico. U. S. Public Health ADVISES vaccination and typhoid and tetanus shots for ALL foreign travel. But they don't say you MUST have them. If I were you, I'd ask my doctor. . . . how we should handle food and drink?"

The general rule they tell you is, "Drink bottled water. Don't eat any raw vegetables or fruit unless you peel it yourself." Big hotel and restaurant people in Mexico assure me they wash all such things in a mild disinfectant. I read a book on tropical hygiene that had so many things you couldn't do, you could hardly go in the first place. I play it as a matter of luck — with the best odds I can contrive. I drink bottled water. I eat salads in the tourist hotels but not in roadside stands. A good bottled water is Tehuacan. Mexican beer wins prizes in Germany. I like Bohemia the best. Eggs, chicken and meat are very good. Along this coast, the fish is the greatest. . . . need hotel reservations?" On this coast in the winter season, you do. Christmas time is crowded. Also true in Mexico City and Acapulco at

that time. On the highway, I think you'll get motels if you stop early enough. About 4 p.m. And don't drive at night. Much of the country is unfenced. The road is full of cattle and burros. And an occasional, unmarked pile of gravel left by yesterday's road crew. Hit one of those, the car stops, you keep going. Up to December, all roads into Mexico are blazing hot for at least two days of driving. We would have been miserable without an air conditioned car. In winter, this coast drive is pleasant. Entry from El Paso can be bitter cold in Chihuahua State. You really need two sets of clothing for winter in Mexico. It can be tropical warm in Acapulco and freezing up in Mexico City. Chances are Mexico City will have warm days and chilly nights. But they get an occasional three-day cold snap that will put you in overcoat and gloves. And sorry you don't have earmuffs.
