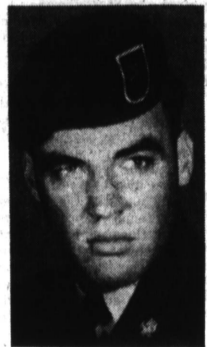


# Vietnam Veteran To Speak

wearer of the legendary "Green Beret," will speak Tuesday at 8 p.m. at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, 355 Avenue D, Redondo Beach.

Davidson, who will discuss "The Viet Cong at Home and Abroad," is appearing under the sponsorship of the Truth About Civil Turmoil (TACT) Committees of Torrance, San Pedro, Hermosa Beach, Rolling Hills, Lomita, and Palos Verdes.

Volunteering for service in 1960, Davidson received extensive training at Ft. Sam Houston, Tex., Ft. Banning, Ga., and Ft. Bragg, N.C., specializing in medicine.

IN 1963, Davidson and 11 other Green Berets in his unit were assigned to War Zone D, then dominated by the Viet Cong forces.

In his address Tuesday, Davidson will discuss the trials and frustrations of his unit in taking and holding one of the early "Strategic Hamlets" which have been established in South Vietnam.

He will show his own on-the-scene color slides, which are backed up by a display of actual Viet Cong booby traps, knives, and exploding wires.

## Teen Gang Robs Home; Harasses Two Sisters

A gang of rowdy teenaged boys harassed a South Torrance girl and her baby sister in their home Saturday night, finally fleeing the premises with \$383 worth of cash, appliances, savings bonds, and other important papers.

The 15-year-old victim told police the boys began creating a disturbance outside the family home at about 8 p.m. She had been left at the home to babysit while her parents were at Disneyland.

After repeatedly yelling and pounding on the door, the boys pried open several windows and entered the house, the girl said. A friend of the family then came by to check on the sisters and chased the boys outside, but as soon as the friend left, the gang reentered the house.

The victim then took the baby and locked herself in the bathroom until the boys left.

The girl told police she recognized several of the boys as former or current students at South High. She said there were several boys whom she did not recognize, as well as several girls who did not enter the house.

When her father returned home about 3:25 a.m. Sunday and discovered the theft, he summoned police.

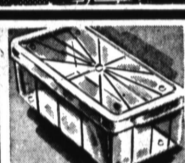
