

El Camino Bumps Into Defending Metro Champs

Santa Monica, defending L.A. Valley, 14-6 and SMCC Metropolitan Conference football champion and a traditional hazard for El Camino, invades Murdock Stadium Friday night.

Again the game will be a duel in passing.

Two years ago the Corsairs scored two touchdowns in the final minute of the game to tie El Camino, 28-28.

The Warriors are tied with Bakersfield for first place in the Metropolitan Conference race. Both El Camino and Bakersfield remain undefeated with 2-0 conference marks.

While the Warriors downed

tempted a 22-yard field goal. The ball hit the cross bar and fell on the wrong side.

Halfback Steve Schmitz led the Camino offensive attack, rolling up 52 yards in 18 carries for one touchdown and hauling in five passes for 53 yards. Schmitz added the last scoring plunge with a 3-yard touchdown, and Schindler booted the extra point.

Schindler, the kicking specialist, has booted 17 of 18 attempted extra point kicks.

Clyde connected on 15 of 33 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown. However, during the first half Clyde had eight consecutive incomplete passes. Nevertheless, when Clyde finally came around the whole team started to click.

Reynolds tallied 24 yards in 11 carries and caught two passes for 35 yards. Reynolds has scored eight TDs.

Valley's only score came with three seconds remaining in the game. Valley quarterback Wayne Radford tossed a ten-yarder to end Tony Moore for the touchdown.

Valley had a 13-yard pass touchdown nullified due to a holding penalty. Although Valley out-rushed Camino, 170-85 yards, the Warriors out-passed the Monarchs, 207-76 yards in the air.

SMCC's whipped Rio Hondo with three touchdown passes, a kickoff return and a pass-interception return.

SMCC quarterback Norm Donaldson completed 10 of 16 passes for 149 yards and three touchdowns. He connected with Randy Whitsitt, Don Edwards and Gene Martin on 25, 65 and 13 yard touchdown passes.

Martin also returned a Rio Hondo kickoff 95 yards while Steve Frederickson ran an intercepted pass 40 yards to the goal.

Battle Looms As Ventura Plays Harbor

A football battle that will determine the leader of the Western States Conference and possibly the championship is shaping up for Saturday night on Casey Field in Wilmington as the Harbor Hawks meet the Ventura Pirates.

The Hawks are fresh from a 24-7 triumph over LACC Ventura last week knocked over a rejuvenated Compton 28-13. They had previously defeated Glendale and the Hawks trounced Pasadena in their first game.

The LACC game was settled early for the Hawks as Gary Bilotti went over from the 1 after four minutes of play. The scoring play was set up by Rich Olson's passes to Herman Franklin and Bob Comstock and a good run by workhorse Bill Tapp. Olson passed to Comstock for the conversion.


