CTA Survey Shows Most Teachers Oppose Strikes

SACRAMENTO—The California Teachers Association (CTA) reported a survey of its members and the members of the National Education Association (NEA) showed 58 per cent were opposed to teacher strikes.

The CTA said the survey showed that only 3 per cent of those questioned would look upon teacher strikes the same as for any other voca-

tion. A total of 37 per cent would permit the strike as a last resort under extreme conditions.

In contrast, the CTA said, only 7 per cent of the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) ruled out the strike completely. The returns showed 9 per cent of the AFT members would use a strike as any other vocation and 79 per cent would hold it for crisis conditions.

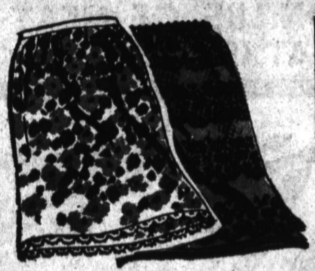

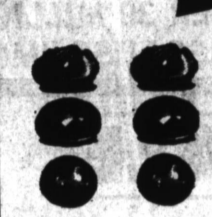

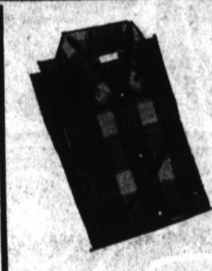
