

San Jose Acclaims ECC Dean

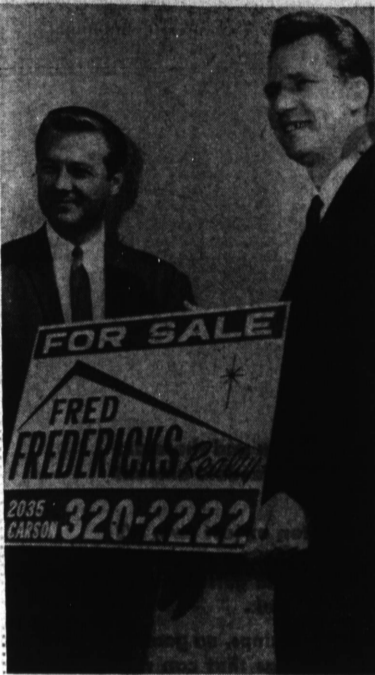
Dr. R. Cline Durfee, dean of the Division of Business Education at El Camino College, has been named by San Jose State College as recipient of an achievement award for outstanding success in the fields of business and business education.

The award, made by the graduate school of the college, was presented to Durfee last Wednesday in San Jose at a dinner in his honor.

Durfee, a 1938 graduate of San Jose, was picked by a committee of professors on the basis of his alumni standing and his accomplishments in business and education. This award is only the third such presentation made since 1933 when the honor was initiated.

A minister, Dr. Durfee has taught school law and finance for Brigham Young University. He was a teacher and accounting area chairman for Fullerton Junior College and a representative of El Camino College to the Council of Centinela Administration Association. He is also the author of "A Handbook for the Directors of Adult Education."

Dr. Durfee came to El Camino in 1965 as dean of the Division of Business Education.

Area Construction Continues Upswing

Only San Diego County, million and \$106 million behind totals for last year. Motor Vehicle Department To Use Computer System

Drivers' license and traffic citation facts about one million California motorists will be instantly accessible, not by searching through a file drawer full of papers but by "dialing" the license number, according to Verne Orr, director of the State Department of Motor Vehicles. Data concerning the rest of the state's 10.5 million drivers are being computerized as fast as possible.

"Every California driver whose permanent license number terminates in 00 through 06 has had his identity and traffic law violation file fed into the computer," Orr said. "By ascending through the digits we are filing additional drivers' records electronically at the rate of 10,000 a week."

By 1970 the records of all

10.5 million California motorists will be instantly accessible, not by searching through a file drawer full of papers but by "dialing" the license number, according to Verne Orr, director of the State Department of Motor Vehicles. Data concerning the rest of the state's 10.5 million drivers are being computerized as fast as possible.

"We are approaching the time," he said, "when peace officers, insurance companies, the DMV, or motorists themselves, can see the non-confidential driving record of any California motorist a minute or two after the inquiring has been fed into the computer in cities from San Diego to Redding."

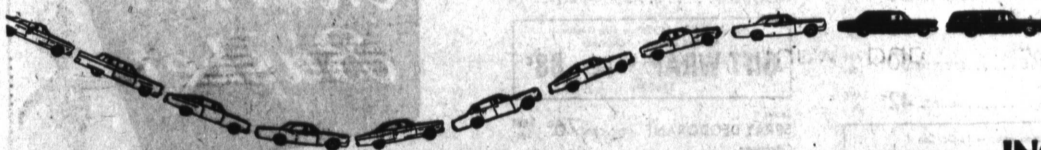
