(Continued from Page A-1) were misguided in their protests.

Councilman David K. Lyman said he had "no quarrel" with Dow, but added that he wanted it "clearly understood that my support of this resolution in no way indicates my support of the dumping of napalm and bombs on civilian areas."

Opposed to the views of Beasley and Lyman, Councilman Ross A. Sciarrotta Sr. affirmed that he believes in United States policies and wants the war to be won "as soon as possible."

THE RESOLUTION followed on the heels of Sunday's anti-war parade and rally, which scored Dow Chemical Co. for its production of napalm for use in the Vietnam conflict.

Mayor Albert Isen commented that the parade down Torrance Boulevard was a "bust" as far as marchers were concerned. He referred to the fact that only about 700 showed up after march leaders had predicted a turnout of 5,000.

The mayor condemned the "seven jerks with Nazi emblems on" who caused a scuffle at El Prado park and also criticized a Los Angeles newspaper for its banner headlines.

Two dressing rooms were added to make a total of five, all of which were repainted, carpeted and re-furnished.

The viewing room has patient files and two 4-bank illuminators for staff doctors to view their patients x-rays.

JOHNSON pointed out that present improvements are in keeping with Riviera's merger plans with Torrance Memorial as it is imperative to keep abreast of the latest advances in cardiovascular specialization.

The new 250-bed Torrance Hospital, to be built on Lomita Boulevard between Hawthorne and Crenshaw Boulevards will include 6,000 square feet for radiology and 3,000 square feet for cardiopulmonary research, Johnson said.

"In the meantime, our present facilities at Riviera offer our patients the most advanced equipment available at this time."

In conjunction with the re-opening, Mayor Isen proclaimed Thursday, Dec. 28, as Dow Chemical Co. Day in Torrance.
