



November Death Toll Increases

SACRAMENTO — Traffic deaths during November in-creased on California highways, as compared to a year ago, but the total for the year still was slightly under that for 1966.

The California Highway
Patrol said 448 persons were
killed during November, as
compared to 424 a year ago.
Through November, 4,349
persons had been killed in
traffic accidents. For the first
11 months of 1966 there

Area Man Gets Two Jail Terms

Johnny Wallace Hedman, 23, of 4417 W. 226th St., was sentenced Monday to a double term, to run concurrently, in state prison.

Judge Bernard Lawler handed down the sentences after Hedman entered guilty pleas to second-degree rob-bery and possession of mari-

juana.

The robbery charge stems from the Nov. 9 robbery of the Village Pharmacy, when \$179 was taken. The marijuana charge was lodged after police stopped Hedman last Sept. 8 on a traffic violation and found a bog which contained marijuana.

Hedman waived his right to talk to probation officers and
