## JA Company Wins Praise For Highway Safety Kit

Los Angeles County Sheriff Peter Pitchess has commended an area Junior Achievement company for selecting a highway emergency safety kit as its product.

The company, sponsored by Northrop Corp.'s Nortronics Division of Hawthorne, kicked off its same campaign recently by presenting the first safety kit to Pitchess.

The sheriff commended the teenagers for selecting such a worthwhile product, and also urged all area residents to support the organization.

"WITH THE holiday season approaching," Sheriff Pitchess said, "All motorists should be prepared for highway emergencies and safety kits such as the Junior Achievement product can be of great help."

The kit, which sells for \$2, contains three highway flares, three day and night reflectors, two accident report forms, an identification and insurance card, a pencil, a new dime to call law enforcement and other emergency agencies and a flare instruction sheet, and is packaged in a reusable plastic container.

job is to soothe the weary and pacify the complainers.

Etched in my memory is the angry man (from my group) that was complaining to the manager of a first class hotel in Japan that there was no hot water in his bathroom. Instead of complaining to me, he upset the entire lobby of this hotel with his loud shouting. This particular man was a chronic troublemaker — luckily his wife could not take time off from her job to accompany him — lucky for her.

ONE PARTICULAR year I managed to have in my group a wealthy couple from the East. They had never traveled abroad and it showed immediately. They expected everything to be as good as it is in America. The food, the hotel accommodations, the business people, the prices — all these and more must be the best. Unfortunately they could not understand that all of these things are better or worse — generally worse — than in America. All they could see was the "filth" of the cities, the total "poverty and ignorance" of the people, and the concern of foreigners for "American money."

There are cultural differences in every country that the traveler must be aware of. There are things that one wouldn't do here in our country — why should one do them in a foreign country. Unless one were a press photographer, one would not try to photograph a man being arrested by a police officer here in the United States. Just my luck to have a man on one of my tours who had to openly photograph a man being arrested in an Eastern European country. When he found himself in a critical situation, all he could think of was to yell at me to call the American Consulate!!

The majority of tourists, however, listen to directions and suggestions and in turn make it easier for everyone. One magic year, I had a perfect gathering of people. They were a joy to conduct — yet it was all due to one strange factor. One of the group was a young school teacher from Florida who was confined to a wheel chair because of Polio at the age of 18 months. Her smile and determination set the tone for the group — no one dared complain, she didn't.

THE MANY tours that have conducted to Europe, the Orient, and also around-the-world have produced some interesting and unusual incidents. The seasoned traveler knows that in any random gathering of individuals such as the average traveler that there will be great people, bores, drinkers, snobs, racists, bargain-shoppers, and you name it — as long as they have the money to pay their way.

One is fortunate to find a group that is truly compatible and has enough respect for each other to make the tour enjoyable. Conditions are always present in any country that will invite criticism from certain people. Most of my groups have been wonderful in their attitude toward traveling. The tour conductor's
