Garden Checklist 1. Berry vines, grapes and strawberries may b planted now. Your nurseryman can recommend

2. Rhododendrons and azaleas may be planted now for spring bloom. Try the Southern Indicas, or Sun Azaleas for sunny garden spots.

3. You can prune roses now, but wait a couple of weeks to prune fuchsias.

4. Plant annuals for late spring bloom. The list includes stocks, snapdragons, pansy, calendula and many others.
