San Pedro Elks Begin New Lodge

Construction of a new lodge for the San Pedro Elks Lodge 966 has been started, following formal ground-breaking ceremonies at the

A contract for the construc-tion has been awarded to Jackson Brothers Construc-tion Co, of Los Angeles on a low bid of \$648,000. The new facility is to be completed within 180 working days.

Located on an 11-acre site at 1748 Cumbre Drive, the new lodge will overlook the Los Angeles Harbor complex. The two-level structure, designed by Architects DeRosa and Daly of Long Beach, con-tains 33,150 square feet. Grand Exalted Ruler Ray-

mond C. Dodson headed the dignitaries participating in groundbreaking ceremonies. Also present were two past Grand Exalted Rulers, R. Leonard Bush and Horace R. Wisely.

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas (D-San Pedro) and Los Angeles City Councilman John S. Gibson, also attended the ceremonies.
The statewide California

Elks Association was represented by Gerald Strohm, president, and John Germer, president, and John Germer, vice president for the South Central District. Harry W. Jordan and Marvin Pike, both district deputies for the statewide group, also were present.

Furnishings for the new lodge will be purchased with funds realized from the sale of the old lodge building. The structure was built in 1911, according to Dodson.

The new lodge will include an octagon-shaped lodge room which can seat 400 persons. Health club facilities, locker rooms, and sauna baths will

occupy the lower level.
