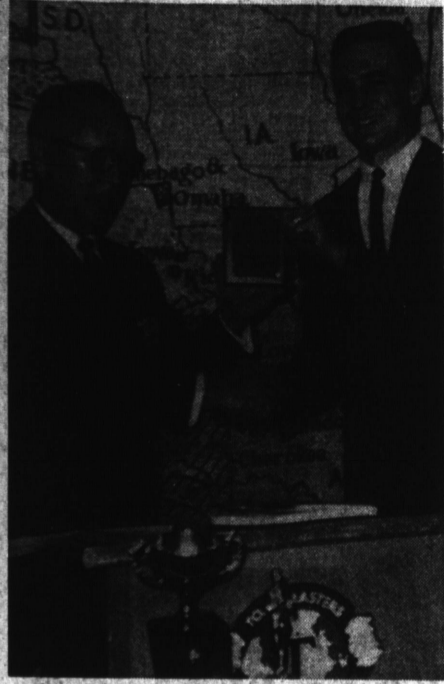
Magazines will be available to the students without charge by presenting their activity book. Copies of the magazine will also be available to non-students for \$1 at the EC bookstore.
