Edison Official To Speak

A simplified explanation of nuclear power—its past, present, and future—will be presented to the Redondo Beach Kiwanis Club Tuesday, Feb. 21.

John Milton Kennedy, host of the Southern California Edison Co. television program, "Science in Action," will be the speaker. The meeting will be held at the Plush Horse Restaurant.

Kennedy, speaking on the subject, "The Atom Comes to Town," will give his listeners a report on the \$87 million San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station. The station is being built by the Edison Co. and the San Diego Gas and Electric Co.

"BECAUSE nuclear power was born with a bomb, many people still think of a mushroom cloud when they think of nuclear development," Kennedy points out. "The fact is, some 250 nuclear reactors have been built in the last 20 years or so, and there has never been a single accident resulting in injury to the public."

The only serious accident in this country, he explains, involved only operating personnel engaged in work on an experimental project which did not have any of the built-in safeguards utilized in a commercial power plant.

As for radioactive emissions, "you would receive far more radioactivity from wearing a radium dial wrist watch for one day than you would from living in the immediate vicinity of our nuclear plant for an entire year," Kennedy declares.
