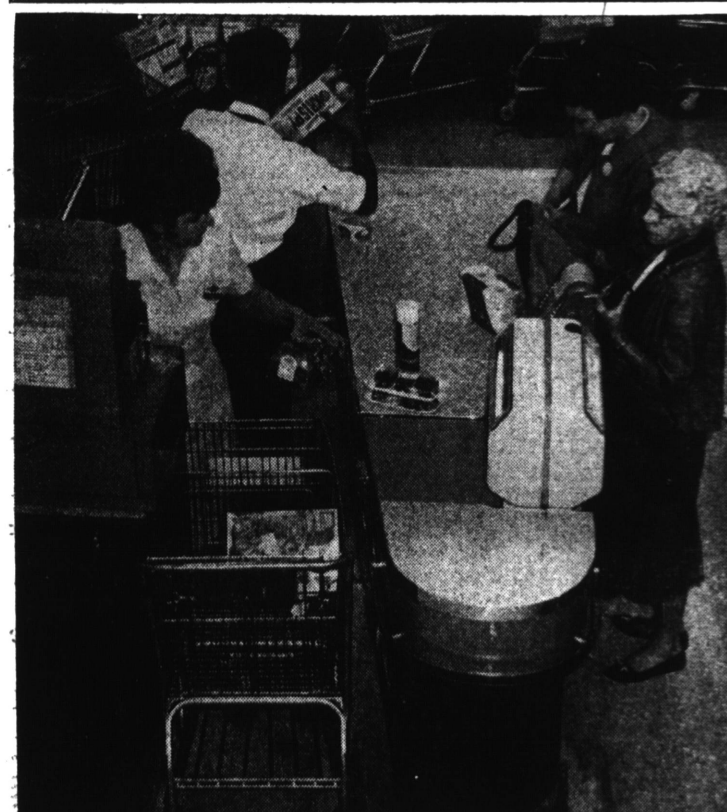

Sepulveda Boulevard Work Set

Plans for the improvement of Sepulveda between Normandie Avenue and Western Avenue in the city of Los Angeles have been sent to the state for final approval.

Councilman John S. Gibson Jr. of the 15th District said bids may be invited by March 1 if state approval is given soon. The work is expected to cost in excess of \$400,000.
