

'Gundo Eyes Basketball's 'Brass Ring'

The CIF "AAA" basketball playoffs get under way Tuesday with North High host to runner up St. Anthony's of the Catholic League. Torrance High was tentatively scheduled to play home team to runner up Rancho Alamitos of the Garden Grove League. Game time for both events is 8 p.m.

Undefeated El Segundo (30-0) is top-seeded for the "AAA" division basketball play-offs.

Coach Cliff Warren's Eagles, seeking to be-come the CIF's first undefeated "AAA" team since 1952, are paired against the second place Warren High of the Coast League.

"Coach" Warren said he did not feel his team would feel the pressure of the 30 game streak in the play-offs. "All year long you wait for the CIF play-offs and you have to be lucky and good to make it through the five games undefeated. Certainly there's some pressure, but it should not effect our play."

"Torrance and Morningside are still the teams to be reckoned with as far as we're concerned,' said Warren. "There's no doubt these are two real

Morningside and Torrance both represent the Sky League in the playoffs. If a flip-of-the-coin is required to determine the league's No. 1 and No. 2 berths, No. 1 team will have an opening round home game against Garden Grove League, No. 2 team Rancho Alamitos, and will be in the same upper bracket with El Segundo.

The No. 2 Sky League team would be in the opposite bracket and be the traveling team against San Gabriel Valley champion Sante Fe.

The No. 2 team would also face a possible second round game against the winner of the Compton (Coast League) vs. Aviation (Pioneer League) opener. Compton is second seeded.

Morningside has a veteran team headed by Stan Love, the posed 6-7 All-CIF center candidate. Nat Baumer, Dave Penso, Kurt Stenderup and Jim Bouton are also responsible for the Monarchs' 23-4

Torrance, inspite of its 21-8 record, has the ingredients for a CIF champion contender. Bart Johnson and Robin Fisher have been in the playoffs two previous years, Dick Kruel was on hand last year, and Steve Jasper has no fears of tough competition.

The darkhorse in the CIF playoffs is North High of Torrance. The Saxons have a 26-3 record, having lost three tournament games in December.

Coach Skip Enger of North says of his quintet, "This is a very young ball club, only two lettermen on the team, Jim Nielson (6-8, junior center) and Bill Albin (6-1, senior guard).'

North Torrance has three juniors, one sophomore and one senior in the starting lineup which leads Enger to comment, "This club completed the best season won-lost record in the school's history to date in spite of youthfulness. They have been amazingly consistant."

Joining Nielson and Albin in the starting unit are Dan Hansen (6-2, junior) at a guard spot. Taylor is the "little" brother of USC's seven-foot center Ron Taylor.
