

On Sounds of Music --- St. Pat's Day



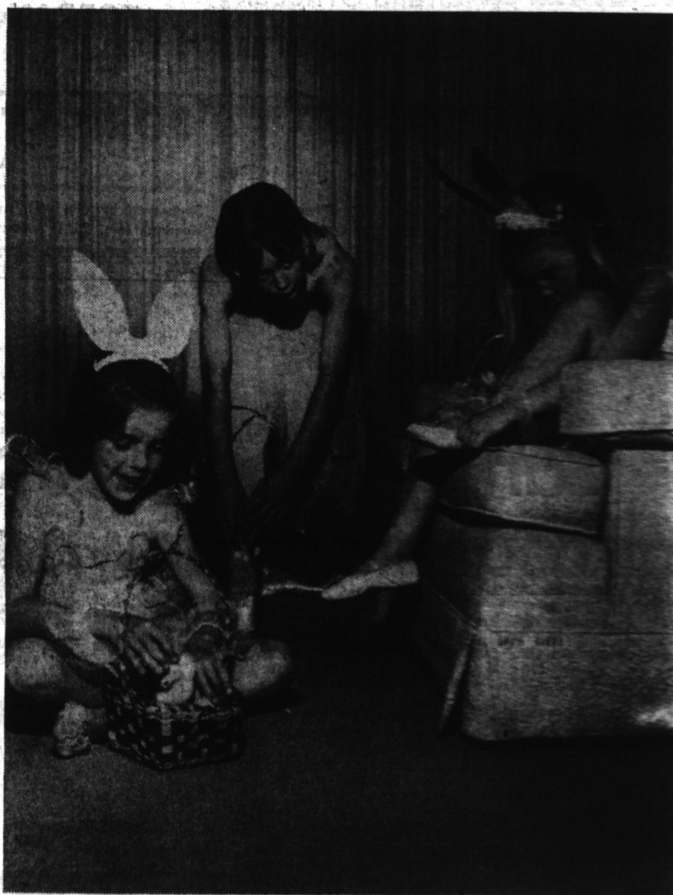
Songs of Erin

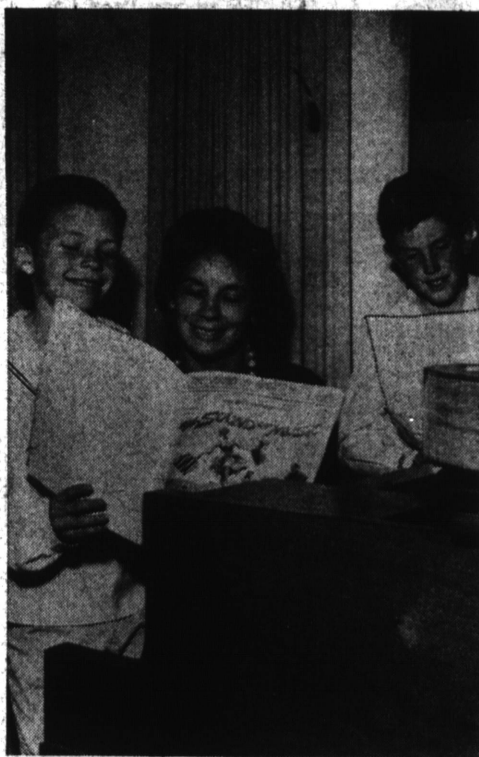
Do Re Mi

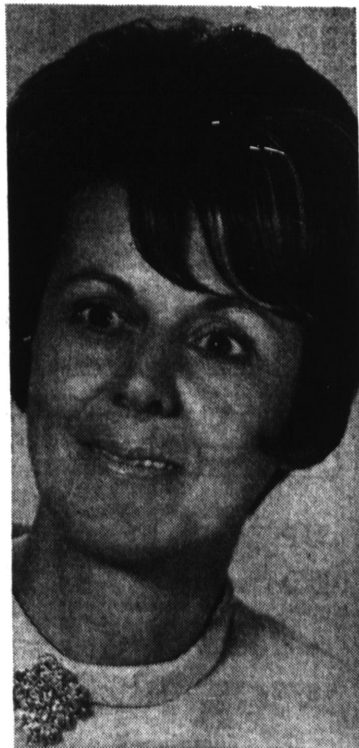
