

Dentifrice Alone Doesn't Provide Tooth Protection

UNTIL 1960, none of the toothpastes evaluated by the ADA was clearly demonstrated to fight tooth decay — advertising claims notwithstanding.

Toothpaste makes brushing teeth more fun, especially for youngsters, but in terms of what's good for your oral health, conscientious brushing is necessary.

In the fall of 1960, however, the association did recognize one dentifrice — a toothpaste containing stannous fluoride. This dentifrice, the association stated, was of "significant value" in preventing dental decay when used as part of a complete oral hygiene program along with regular professional care.

Claims that a dentifrice alone or a mouthwash can provide a shield against decay, prevent bad breath or gum disease simply are not true, reports the American Dental Association.

In other words, this toothpaste was still not a substitute for good oral health practices, but it would help prevent decay, provided you used your toothbrush as you should and regularly visited your dentist.

The association, national organization of the nation's dentists, regularly checks products that claim to help your dental health, and issues reports on their demonstrated value or lack of value.

THE TOOTH PASTE recognized by the association had been clinically tested over a period of years and had proved effective in actual tests on children. The association's report was issued only after its value had been actually demonstrated.

Since the ADA's first report, other manufacturers have added stannous fluoride to their products, but, according to the association's Council on Dental Therapeutics, each product requires independent clinical investigation. A number of dentifrices containing stannous fluoride are currently being investigated, and a total of three are now recognized as "of significant value."

As for mouthwashes, the association states there is no evidence that the average person needs to use a medicated mouthwash.

IN SHORT, neither mouthwash nor sporadic use of a dentifrice can substitute for regular toothbrushing or professional dental treatment. None will give all-day protection with one brushing or provide an invisible shield against tooth decay. None will prevent bad breath from all causes or gum disease.

Your best program for oral health remains: toothbrushing after each meal; a proper diet, low in sweets; fluoridation of drinking water, and regular visits to your family dentist.

Hawthorne Earnings Decrease

Net earnings of \$682,966 before taxes have been reported for the 12-month period which ended last Dec. 31 by Hawthorne Financial Corp. Vernon D. Herbst, executive vice president of the firm, said the earnings were equal to \$1.18 per share, based on 750,000 plus outstanding shares.

Earnings in 1965 were \$1,227,701 of \$1.50 per share, Herbst said. Total assets of the corporation 1239 pages up and savings accounts increased from \$63.8 million to nearly \$68.4 million. Real estate loans amounted to \$73.6 million.

A 5 per cent stock dividend has been declared, payable April 15 to shareholders of record at the close of business March 15.

Safety Guides May Prevent Poisoning

More than a million persons are poisoned each year in the United States—most of them children, Iwao Mochidome, president of the South Bay Pharmaceutical Association, said today.

"Each year, hundreds of thousands of children accidentally swallow medicines and common household products," Mochidome said. "Many of these ingestions result in hospitalization, or at least require treatment for poisoning."

HE SAID medicines account for half of all accidental poisonings involving children under 5 years of age. "If a product is found in the home, you can be sure that at one time or another a child has tried to eat it," Mochidome said.

During National Poison Prevention Week, he urged parents to spend some time "poison proofing" their homes. Suggestions he offered include:

- Store all medicines out of reach of children, preferably in locked cabinets or closets.
- Always refer to medicine by its proper name, not as "candy."
- Take or give medicines in well-lighted rooms and always read the label carefully before use.
- Clean out medicine cabinets regularly and discard medicines which are no longer needed.
- Dispose of medicines and

household products by flushing them down the drain and then washing out the containers before throwing them into rubbish containers.

- Store household preparations such as lye, cleaning agents, detergents, and insecticides in cabinets out of the reach of children.
- Never store non-edible substances in food or beverage containers.
- Call a physician promptly if a potentially toxic substance has been swallowed.

OBSERVANCES of National Poison Prevention Week are scheduled throughout the area, said Mrs. Harold Roache, Palos Verdes, committee chairman.
