

Council Candidate Hits Airport Terminal Plans

Prospects that a jet passenger terminal will be built at the Torrance Municipal Airport should concern every property owner in the city, William J. Uerkwitz, a candidate for the Torrance City Council, said this week.

Uerkwitz was responding to statements reported earlier this week by Jack Egan, manager of the Torrance Municipal Airport. Egan said the airport should have a jet passenger terminal and commuter jet airlines averaging 150 landings per month by 1970.

"The prospect of jet aircraft operating out of the Torrance airport seriously concerns all of the property owners for miles around the airport," Uerkwitz said. "We don't want what happened to Inglewood, Lennox, Westchester, and Playa del Rey to happen to Torrance."

UERKWITZ said property values plunged downward and large numbers of homeowners sold their home to get away from the whine of jet engines.

He said the closeness of the Los Angeles and Long Beach airports and the location of freeways mean "it is not necessary to subject the residents and homeowners of Torrance to the extreme discomfort, inconvenience, and danger of jet traffic."

Uerkwitz also said the presence of jet aircraft at the local airport pose a safety problem for the pilots of small planes now using the runways because of "extensive turbulence caused by jet engines."

When jets are based at any airport, private flying takes a back seat and is often pushed out completely," the candidate said.

UERKWITZ said he feels the greatest growth potential for the Torrance facility will be realized "by catering to"




