for urban renewal! All of the structures in the 23600 block of Madison Street and all of the structures on the east side of the 23600 block of Ward Street are city property. They were purchased with funds from an airport bond issue and a federal grant of matching funds for aid to airports.

They were supposed to be demolished to establish a clear zone for the original airport runway.

Instead, these structures have been allowed to stand, deteriorate, and become a blighted area. This had a very detrimental effect on adjacent property. In other words, city-owned property was the start of slums in Torrance.

In addition to this, the city of Torrance placed a moratorium on all building, all repairs, all remodeling, even on demolition in the area — a move designed to assure that the city-bred slum would continue to develop - downward.
