

Witnesses To Attend Assembly

Leonard Olliff, presiding minister of the Torrance congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, announced today that final plans are being made by the congregation to attend the semi-annual circuit assembly at Mira Costa High School.

The Torrance congregation will meet with the 17 other congregations of California Circuit No. 16 during the three-day session from April 5 to 7.

Olliff added that 1,800 persons are expected to attend the free public discourse on Sunday at 3 p.m. entitled "Why Does God Permit Wickedness?" The public is invited to attend.

Cal-State Expands Teacher Curriculum

President Leo F. Cain of the California State College, Dominguez Hills, announced today that the college will begin its second year of teacher preparation in the fall quarter with an expanded program of course offerings.

The college teacher education program prepares students for teaching credentials at both the elementary and secondary level. Persons who have completed the bachelor's degree at any accredited institution may apply for admission to the Cal State-Dominguez campus.

Candidates should have completed courses in developmental psychology and learning. These particular courses,

however, may be taken during the coming spring quarter or in summer session at any accredited college or university.

Several new faculty members will join the staff in professional education next year. The faculty will work closely with carefully selected master teachers from neighboring school districts in a highly individualized program of preparation.

Application forms for the teacher education program may be obtained by contacting the office of the Director of Teacher Education Programs at the college before April 15.

High School Journalists Will Spend 'Day in Navy'

The ninth annual "Day in the Navy" for high school journalists will be aboard eight ships, instead of the usual one, April 10 and 11.

More than 200 students of journalism in Los Angeles City and County schools will be guests at an air station and at sea, under sponsorship of Public Affairs Co. 11-12, Los Angeles.

Students will see the Navy at work and write stories and take pictures for their high school newspapers. Published stories and photos will be rewarded with prizes ranging from college scholarships to a typewriter and a camera.

For the first time the students will have an opportunity to observe firsthand some of the lesser known, but very essential, ships which comprise the Navy's striking force.

They will be divided among a guided missile destroyer, two destroyers, four mine sweeps and a fleet oiler.

Students will arrive at Los Alamitos Naval Air Station for a tour-demonstration of its facilities. They will sleep in barracks and leave early the next morning for Long Beach Naval Base to have breakfast and board their ships.

During their cruise the

boys will witness typical naval exercises such as under way refueling from the oiler, anti-submarine warfare, simulated attacks by jets, firing at surface and aerial targets and daily routines aboard ship.

Joining the youthful reporters will be teachers, educators, members of the boards of education, and guests from the civic world.

More than 2,500 aspiring reporters have "gone to sea" for a day since the Public Affairs Co. started this program of showing how it is really done and letting the students assess the situation in their own words.

Faculty to Host SCOPE Programs

Peter Henderson, speech and theater arts instructor, will present "The Importance of Stage Business and Movement in Comedy" to be aired April 12.

Coordinator of the El Camino series of programs is John W. Morrow, dean of the division of physical education and athletics at the college.
