CRITERIA used by judges to determine winners will include: creative ability, scientific thought, thoroughness, technical skill, knowledge of student, and project report.

Displays will be set up Wednesday, May 1. Public viewing will take place from 9 a.m. to noon Thursday and from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Friday.

Student tours will also be conducted during the public viewing hours.

Judging will be held from 1 to 3 p.m., Thursday, May 2, and awards will be presented Friday at 7 p.m.

SUPPLEMENTING student exhibits will be a lobby display of new science materials from the Educational Materials Building used by the school district to support the science program.

The Press Club is a professional organization comprising 1,200 members representing all areas of communications—newspapers, magazines, television, radio, advertising, and public relations.

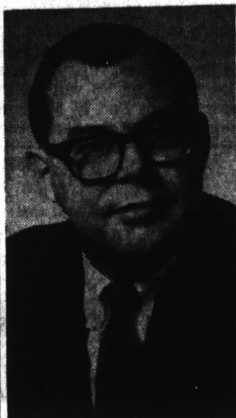
