## Supervisors Get Report On Storm Drain Projects County supervisors have received and filed a quarterly report on status of the 1958 and 1964 storm drain bond issue programs, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today.

The summary was put to-gether by Chief Engineer Wal-ter, J. Wood of the County Flood Control District.

The latest rundown reveals plans for 99 per cent of the regular projects called for under the 1958 programs have been received by the District for processing, Chace said. Of these, 180 out of 184 or 98 per cent have been advertised for bids or constructed. Some 98 per cent of the construction funds have been committed or spent on these projects.

. . . THE 1958 program includes 68 projects authorized for in-stallation out of savings on regular jobs. Plans for 72 per cent of these have been received, 54 per cent have been advertised or built, and 54 per cent of the funds allocated have been spent or committed. Overall, Chace said plans for 92 per cent of the regular and supplemental projects have been turned in for processing. 86 per cent representing 217 projects out of the 252 called for have been advertised or built. And \$162 million of the

total construction fund allot-ment of \$179 million has been spent or committed.

Plans for 66 per cent of the projects included in the 1964

program have been received. Of this total, 46 per cent have been constructed or advertised for bids, Chace said.

FIGURES reveal that .\$54 million out of a total of \$197 million in construction funds have been spent or com-mitted. This is a \$6 million increase since the January report and is expected to continue to rise as plans for larg-er, projects are received by the district from the cities who are doing the design work.

In a related action, supervisors have authorized sale of another \$10 million in 1964 bonds, Chace said. Bids are currently being sought and will be opened by the board May 7.

Proceeds from the sale, when added to present cash when added to present cash and investment balances, will finance construction of proj-ects until this fall, Chace added.
