Some weeks ago, I called your attention to the RTD line 64 from Pasadena to Pomona, a most interesting trip.

This week, may I suggest an ocean trip by bus. Now, before you get the idea that old Artie has flipped his wig, read on. The 55 line from the new terminal in Los Angeles goes all the way to Balboa, passing through the beach cities of Belmont Shore, Seal Beach, Sunset Beach, Huntington Beach, Newport Beach, and finally Balboa. Not only that, but the bus follows the Pacific Coast Highway. If you like the smell of salt spray, or enjoy a peek at teeny weeny bikinis, this trip is a must.

It's difficult to realize that in this asphalt and concrete jungle we call Los Angeles, a kid can fish for real, live fish. I remember back when I was a kid, they called me the "Scourge of White River." No fish was ever safe when I came on the scene. That's my story, and I'm sticking with it. In the Los Angeles area, there are three well stocked lakes, just waiting for the pint-sized Isaac Waltons to try their luck: the Hollenbeck Park Lake between the 47 line and the 72 line, Lincoln Park Lake on the 8, 52, 53 and 92 lines, and Echo Park Lake on the 39, 42, and 91 lines. Remember, Griffith Park is easily reached by RTD line 23. Many lines throughout the city connect with line 23, including Pasadena - Eagle Rock - Glendale line 31, Hollywood lines 42, 93, and cross-town line 95. Send for a system map and join the fun.

Q. Please send me one of the new maps and tell me if the monthly pass is good on the Inglewood lines. Mr. J.C.

A. The former Inglewood City lines have now been merged into the RTD, and all the benefits RTD has are applicable to these lines, including the monthly pass. You'll get your map pronto!

Q. When does the service to Marineland start? I want to go some day soon, and I understand this is only summer service. Mrs. L.O.J.

A. Judging from your letter I must guess where you would be starting from: shame on you. The postmark said Inglewood, so I guess that's where you live. You can get to Marineland anytime by taking the 54 bus on Manchester to the Harbor Freeway and catching the 9:28 Flyer to San Pedro and transferring to the 127 line.

Q. We live near Imperial and Crenshaw, and I need to go to downtown Los Angeles several times next month. What bus can I get and where? M.T.

A. Catch the RTD 101 line on Crenshaw to Manchester, and transfer to the 5 line Flyer running east on Manchester. Flyer buses run between 6:27 and 8:15 a.m. Check your timetable for the schedule you can use.

Bill Seeks Changes in Bid Notices

Legislation establishing a uniform system of publication of construction bid notices by public agencies has been introduced in the Assembly by Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend (D-Torrance).

Townsend said the bill, A.B. 1377, would provide substantial cost savings for public agencies, at the same time pre-

serving the historic tradition of requiring bid notices to specific minimum wages to be paid on the construction work being bid.

The bill's principal features are (1) a uniform two-publication system for all public agencies, and (2) legal authority for an agency to group a number of bid notices into

one advertisement. Present law varies from agency to agency, and in many instances bid notices presently are required to be published ten times.

The legislation is based on a comprehensive study conducted by the California Newspaper Publishers Association following the legisla-

New Unit Approved In Barrier

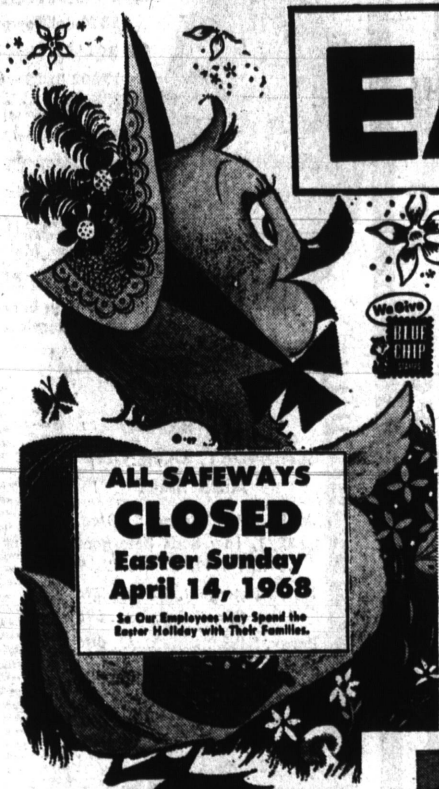
Supervisors this week approved an agreement as part of the development of the Dominguez Gap sea barrier projects in the Wilmington area, Supervisor Burton W. Chase said today.

The agreement calls for the County Flood Control District to deposit \$98,000 with West Basin Municipal Water District to pay the balance of the \$129,000 cost for designing and constructing a water supply connection for the project.

An initial deposit of \$31,000 was authorized by supervisors last June 27.

WEST BASIN Municipal Water District has made arrangements for the work with the Metropolitan Water District since it affects MWD's Second Lower Feeder and Vic-

toria Street-223rd Street feeder line. Supervisor Chase said water from the feeders will supply "recharge" wells at the Dominguez Gap project which will create a "mound" to halt encroachment of sea brine. The Dominguez Gap undertaking is one of three similar programs underway by the Flood Control District to protect the area's vital underground water supplies.
