

Episcopal Church to Open Three-Day Conference Here

The 3-day Los Angeles Liturgical Conference, sponsored by the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles and the Associated Parishes Inc., will open April 22 with its purpose to "confront God's world" and to investigate the liturgy as the activity of men celebrating the presence of God in their daily lives.

The Diocese of Los Angeles, largest in the Episcopal Church, covers the eight southern counties of California. The Associated Parishes Inc., is a fellowship of clergy and laity dedicated to the advancement of the liturgical movement in the life of the Episcopal Church.

"The Liturgy: A Celebration of Worldly Men" is the stated theme of the conference. It is designed to be useful to churchmen on every level of involvement.

THE CONFERENCE will open Monday, April 22, at 2 p.m. in the Statler-Hilton Hotel. The opening session will feature major addresses by the Very Rev. Samuel J. Wyllie, dean of the General Theological Seminary, and the Rev. Daniel Berrigan, S.J., author, poet and member of the faculty at Cornell University.

In the evening, the conference banquet will feature a special presentation, prepared in consultation with the Sisters of Immaculate Heart College of Los Angeles, on the realities — that awesome mixture of good and evil, of

the beautiful and the ugly — which characterize this imperfect world, shaping the lives of worldly men within it.

The April 23 morning session will draw together the previous day's speakers and some of the conference seminar leaders in a colloquium in which there will be provisions for discussion and questions from all delegates.

Four special-interest seminars will be offered Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday

morning led by persons of excellent reputation and particular knowledge and experience. Each delegate may select one seminar.

WILLIAM PEREIRA, F.A.I.A., consulting architect and city planner, will lead the seminar on "Architecture and Human Existence." Dr. Rosemary Ruether, Roman Catholic Theologian and member of the faculty of Howard University, and Georgetown University, will lead the seminar on

"Theology and the Worldly Man." The seminar on "Art and Communication" will be led by Sister Mary Corita, I.H.M., and Sister Mary Lenore, I.H.M., members of the faculty of Immaculate Heart College. The seminar on "Liturgy and Music" will be led by the Rev. Norman Mealy, professor of Church Music at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, and the Rev. Lawrence Rouillard, chairman of the Commission on Liturgy and Church Music

of the Diocese of Los Angeles. Tuesday afternoon at 3:30 p.m. there will be a presentation by the Western Behavioral Sciences Institute with the theme "The World Responds to God in Worship through People — Dynamic Worship Depends on Human Involvement." Institute personnel will give a demonstration of living liturgy and human encounter.

TUESDAY EVENING,

April 23, at 8 p.m. there will be a session held in the First Methodist Church, 8th and Hope Streets, Los Angeles, which will be open to the general public. It is designed to celebrate the presence of the word of God in His world through the employment of a dramatic variety of media.

It is not possible to predict exactly what will take place during this service. The ingredients stretch from a scene from "Who's Afraid

of Virginia Woolf?" to readings from Hosea and Joel. From a dance performed to the final chorus of Bach's "St. Matthew Passion" to traditional hymns led by a choir of 400 representing various churches of several denominations in Southern California.

It will be an ecumenical celebration. It will be a unique celebration.

THE CONFERENCE concludes with the Wednesday

noon joyous celebration of the Holy Eucharist at St. John's, Los Angeles, with Dean Wyllie as preacher, using forms practical in any congregation.

During the conference, exhibit areas adjacent to the meeting rooms will feature selected artisans and craftsmen, architectural designs and a unique group of "play-pray" rooms for delegate use. A special exhibit by Sister Mary Corita promises to be of particular interest.
