

## Hadassah Hospital to Benefit from Party

A gala spring party featuring games of all kinds will be presented by the South Bay Chapter of Hadassah at the home of Miss Jennie Tufeld of Rolling Hills on Tuesday, April 23, at 1 p.m.

After partaking of dessert, guests will make their choice of amusement from tables of bridge, canasta, pan, and Mah Jong. Proceeds from the affair will go to the Hadassah Hospital in Jerusalem and Youth Aliyah, a fund for rehabilitating young refugees from the Arab and Iron Curtain countries.

The Hadassah Hospital is a 600-bed institution which treats more than 17,000 patients annually. It has done pioneer work in cancer research, heart surgery, and leprosy, among other fields, and has attracted students from Africa, Asia, and Eu-

rope. Recently twenty-one Arab doctors from hospitals of the West Bank of the Jordan made their first visit to this famous hospital.

Youth Aliyah was founded in 1934 by Henrietta Szold and Recha Freier to rescue Jewish children from Nazi Germany. Because of continuing need, it has existed to this day, having brought over 100,000 children to Israel in its 34-year history. Today there are 10,000 wards in training in 267 Youth Aliyah villages, agricultural centers, and special schools in Israel.

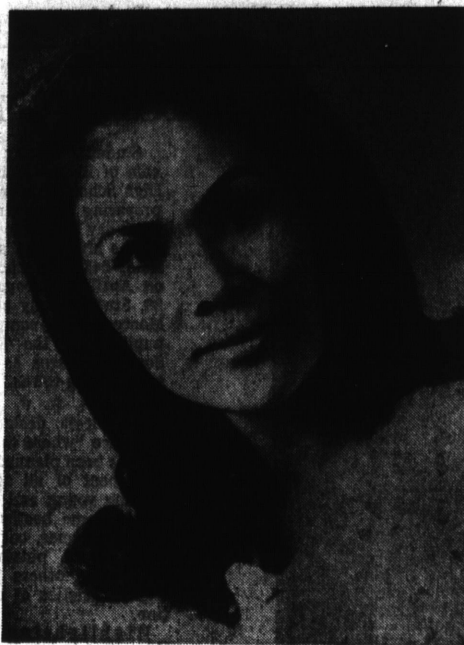
