

Kindergarten Round-Ups Scheduled by Schools

Kindergarten round-ups for youngsters who will be starting school next fall will be held at elementary schools throughout Torrance during the next two months.

Purpose of the event is to register students in advance and offer preliminary health screening.

To qualify for September entrance in Kindergarten, children must be at least 5 years old on or before Dec. 2, 1968. Birth certificates or other proof of birthdate is required.

IN ACCORDANCE with state law, all students must have polio inoculations before they start school. In addition, the law requires that an individual being admitted for the first time in California, as a pupil in any school district, must present evidence of immunity to measles, either as a result of having had measles (rubeola) or of having been immunized against measles. All preschool children are advised to have an eye examination by a vision specialist.

Parents are advised to call the school in their attendance area to set up round-up appointments.
