\$1.4 Billion County Budget Given to Board

A county budget which seeks a 24.9-cent tax hike to finance the expenditures of nearly \$1.4 billion was handed to the Board of Supervisors yesterday.

Lindon S. Hollinger, county administrative officer, submitted the preliminary budget, which he said is up some 10.3 per cent from last year.

He called for a \$1.1 billion spending program for the county's general fund. The remainder is for special districts and services to cities. The later is paid for the individual cities and it is not reflected in the proposed tax rate.

Hollinger said it would require a general fund tax rate
