

Blood Donors Sought

A goal of 600 pints of blood is set by Red Cross for the three bloodmobile visits in the area this month.

All of the scheduled visits are open to the public, according to Denver Bullock, Red Cross board chairman. "Giving the gift of life, blood, is one of the best ways to provide protection for yourself and the community when sickness and illness strike," said Bullock.

The first community mobile will visit the Torrance YMCA, 2900 W. Sepulveda Blvd., Friday from 2 to 6:30 p.m.

Another mobile in Torrance will be stationed at the Elks Lodge 1948, 1820 Abalone St., May 23, from 2 to 6:30 p.m.

The last bloodmobile is May 29, at the Palos Verdes Baptist Church, 28 W. Moccasin Lane, Rolling Hills Estates. Scheduled from 3 to 7:30 p.m.

Aviation Course Planned

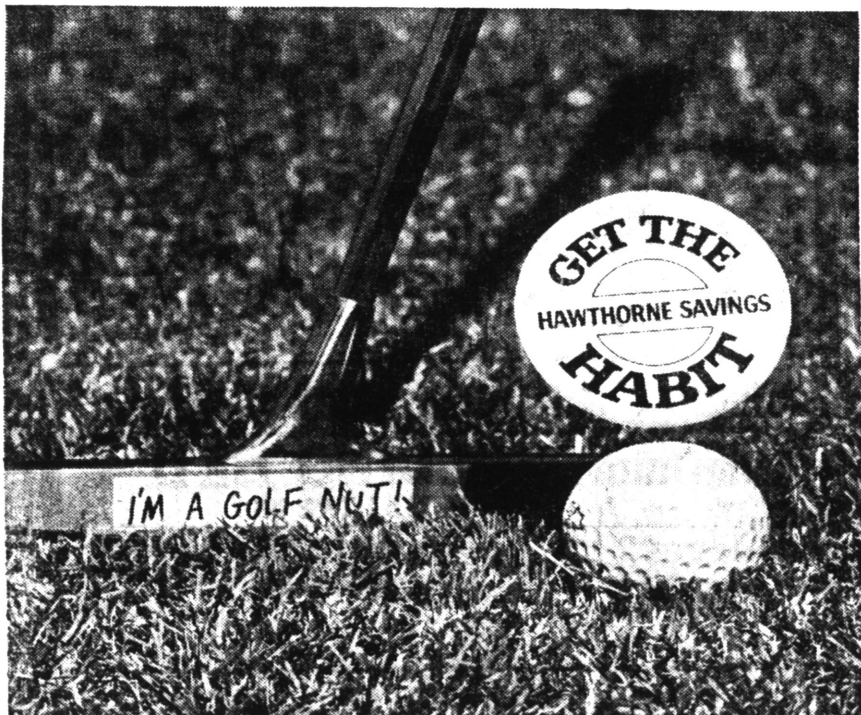
