Standing high above the neighborhood in which they're located, are the Watts Towers, truly a legend, a masterpiece in 20th Century folk art. Simon Rodia, a man who translated a vision into a lasting monument, worked 33 long years without designs, drawing boards, or machinery. The Watts Towers have become a historical landmark by the Municipal Arts Department, Cultural Heritage Board. If you haven't seen this magnificent display of structural art, plan to do so, soon. Located at 1765 East 107th Street in Watts, it's easily reached on the RTD 33 line, starting from the downtown terminal in Los Angeles.

Spring has sprung all over the Southland and I have a suggestion that could provide a delightful one day vacation. Descanso Gardens, located in the foothill city of La Canada, is a display of plants and shrubs like you've never seen before. 6,000 rose bushes, 100,000 camellias representing 600 varieties, lilacs, azaleas, fuchsias, and rhododendrons. If that's not enough, there is a Japanese tea house serving tea and cookies. How does that grab you? You can visit this lovely place on RTD Line 19 from downtown Glendale. Many lines either serve Glendale directly or transfer to it. From Pasadena and Hollywood, Line 31 connects with the 19 line at Broadway and Brand. Check your map or send for a timetable soon. One word of caution—There is a 6 block walk from the 19 line to the Gardens, but it is well worth the effort.

On the waterfront in San Pedro is one of the most fascinating collections of shops and restaurants I have ever seen. Ports O' Call Village is the spot, representing the ultimate in unusual shops, fine eateries, sea lure, stuff like that. RTD Line 37 leaves from the terminal in downtown Los Angeles and goes directly to this fun spot. Drop me a line and I'll send you a timetable with your map. A good place to take Uncle Fred or Aunt Minnie when they arrive from Bartlesville or Topeka.

Q. Recently I heard advertised over the radio, a place called Mile High Skyline Park on Mt. Wilson. How can I get there by bus? Mrs. L.E.I.

A. You can't, or at least I've no knowledge of any bus service to the Park.

Q. How can I go from Hawthorne to Whittier, California? Mrs. C.C.M.

A. If you will catch the RTD 5 line on Hawthorne Boulevard and ride to 6th, you can transfer to the 72 line going east on 6th to Whittier. I'll send you timetables and a map.

Q. How often does the bus on Century Boulevard run, and how late at night can I return from the Airport to Watts? L.P.

A. 11:50 p.m. is the latest bus and they run every 30 minutes.

Q. How can I go from Torrance to downtown Los Angeles? I live near Carson & Crenshaw. Mrs. L.O.

A. The Torrance Municipal Bus Lines 1 goes to downtown Los Angeles.

Q. How do I get to Busch Gardens from Lawndale? F.K.

A. Take the 5 line to Crenshaw Boulevard, change to the 85 line to Hollywood and Highland, then the 93 line to Van Nuys & Roscoe Boulevard, and last, the 16 line to the Gardens.

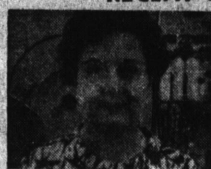
