## Federal Funds Approved For Storm Drain Work

An application for \$1,395,600 in federal funds to help finance a Carson area storm drain project has been approved.

The County Flood Control District applied for the funds earlier this year, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said. They will be granted under provisions of the Federal Housing and Urban Development Act of 1965.

Hahn said the facility, project 1153, when combined with

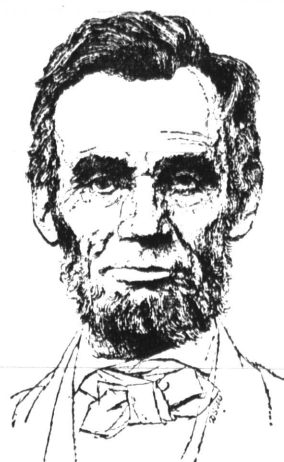
projects 685 and 1232, will complete the Torrance lateral drainage system. Total cost of the system is pegged at about \$2.8 million.

Routing of the system begins at the intersection of Torrance Boulevard and Vermont Avenue, follows the alignment of an existing earth channel north 850 feet and east 900 feet to a drain at Hamilton Avenue north of Torrance Boulevard.

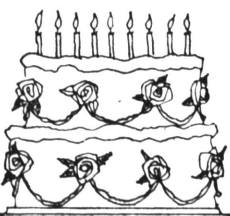

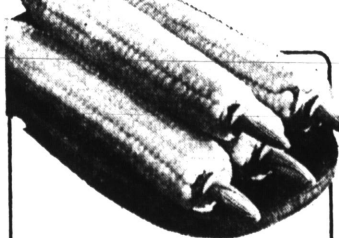
