

Offering to Benefit Adventist Servicemen

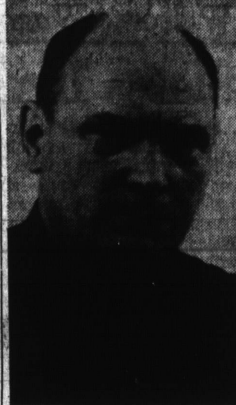
Members of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave., will forge a "link of concern" with Adventist servicemen in a special offering to be received Saturday.

In announcing the special offering, Pastor David H. Pillor said, "We want to demonstrate our support of our 7,000 Adventist young men serving in the United States armed forces around the world, and to show them we have a strong tie with them."

"We are proud of our young men," Pastor Pillor said. "Most register as conscientious objectors, but they are not draft-card burners or draft dodgers."

"Adventist young men respond to the draft, and most become unarmed medics when they are inducted," he said. "In this way they can serve their country without taking life. Right now, about 550 Adventists are serving in Vietnam, where at least 35 have been killed in action. They have been awarded 8 Silver Stars and 22 bronze stars for valor on the battlefield."

Pastor Pillor also announced the opening of a \$200,000 servicemen's center in Washington, D.C., which is operated by the Adventist Denomination.

Five local congregations have been linked together by the Union of two nationwide denominations under a common name, forming the country's largest Protestant church.

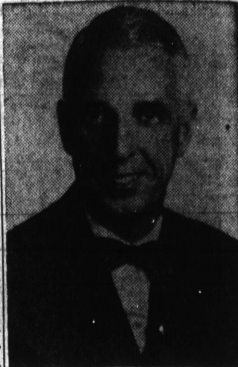
The new denomination will be known as the United Methodist Church, embracing some 11,000,000 Americans. The merger wed the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church.

A service of union for the two denominations was scheduled Tuesday in Dallas, Tex. The actual merger, however, will not come until 1969, according to the Rev. Arthur L. Nagel, pastor of the First Methodist Church of Torrance.

This city's three Methodist and two E.U.B. churches will continue to operate as usual until that date, the Rev. Nagel said.
