Crash Victim Conscious

A Torrance teenager who had been unconscious for nearly five weeks following a traffic accident came to last Thursday.

Spokesmen at Bay Harbor Hospital said that 16-year-old Kenneth Goins, 2205 Gramercy Ave., is talking rationally and recognizes members of his family.

However, hospital officials said they cannot tell yet whether there is an permanent brain damage. Goins does not remember the April 6 accident that took the lives of three of his friends and has shown no curiosity about why he is in the hospital.

Goins was knocked unconscious when the van in which he was riding ran off the road near Blythe, Calif. He and six friends were motoring toward an Easter week rendezvous on the Colorado River.

Another victim of the mishap, Everett Erickson, 15, of 1327 Acacia Ave., lies paralyzed at Riverside General Hospital. He will be in traction indefinitely, but is now out of the intensive care unit.

tunnel, hidden Viet Cong opened fire.

"With complete disregard for his personal safety, Diestelhorst fired down the tunnel and moved to engage the insurgents," the Bronze Star citation reads. "He killed one Viet Cong, wounded two others and captured them."

A few weeks later, Diestelhorst was injured while in action and was awarded the Purple Heart.
