Q. The average time is about 25 minutes. I'll send you a timetable and a map.

Q. Please tell me how to get to Ports O' Call. I read about the place in your column. I live near the 54 line on Manchester in Inglewood. Mrs. M. B.

A. Take the 54 line to the Harbor Freeway, and change to the 37 line, stopping on the service road of the freeway. The 37 line goes to the Ports O' Call Village.

Kiwanis Kick Off World Trade Week

George Schmitz, vice president, international department, Wells Fargo Bank, will give the World Trade Week address to the Southwest Torrance Kiwanis Club at noon Thursday at Filippone's Restaurant.

The 42nd annual World Trade Week will be May 19 through 25, sponsored by the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce in co-operation with the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach, Los Angeles International Airport, Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, and the Los Angeles Clearing House Association.

Emphasis will be on a person-to-person trade promotion. Foreign businessmen have been encouraged to come to the Los Angeles metropolitan area during the week. They will be honored by the local business community and will be given every possible assistance during their stay.

World Trade Week, which was originated in Los Angeles, is now proclaimed nationally by President Johnson. It occurs annually on the week that included National Maritime Day, May 22.

Bids Due For Lomita Facilities

Bids to build additional storm drain facilities in the Lomita area will be opened Friday, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today.

The cost is estimated at \$127,000. Chace said the bid opening is set for 11 a.m. in the offices of the County Flood Control District. The Board of Supervisors is expected to award a contract 10 days later.

Slated for construction is a project which will be financed from savings on regular projects included in the 1958 storm drain bond issue program. NEARLY a mile and a half long, the drain is expected to take about six months to complete, Chace said. The drain begins in 254th Street west of Western Avenue, runs in 254th to Walnut Street, in Walnut to Ebony Lane, and in Ebony Lane to Lomita Boulevard. The contractor will be required to erect a temporary five-foot-high chain link fence around the trench when work moves past Alexander Fleming Junior High School at 254th Street and Walnut Avenue, Chace added.
