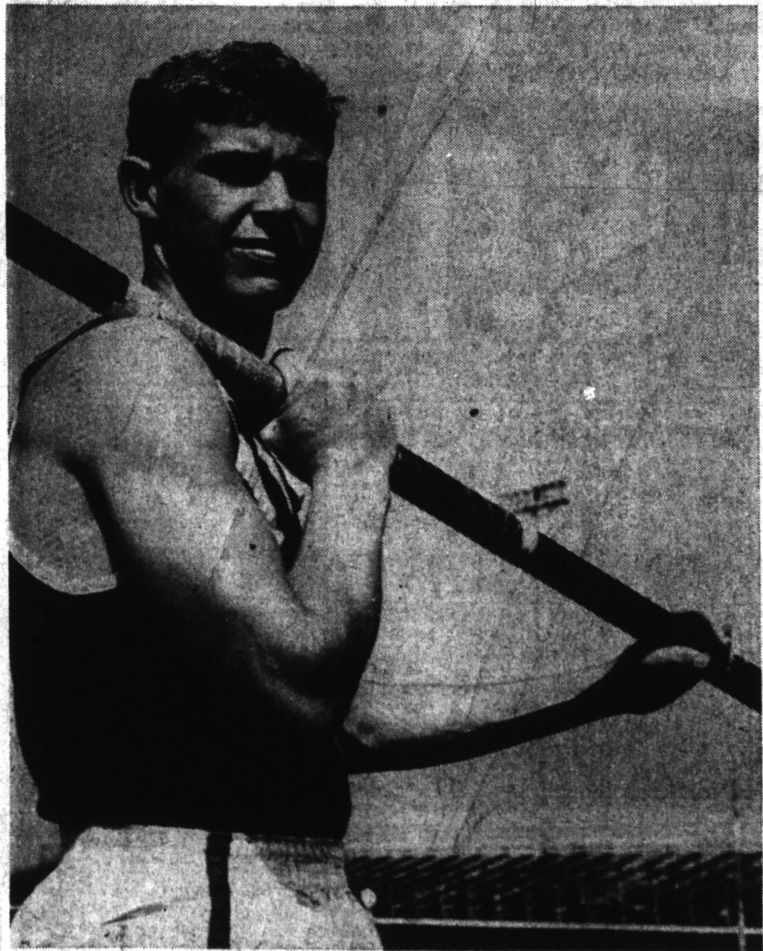

CERRITOS IS HOST TO MEET

Top track and field competitors from Southern California will perform at Cerritos College this week in prelims and finals of the Southern California Junior College championships.

Preliminary competition is scheduled to begin in Cerritos Stadium today. The top seven in field events and top nine in running events will proceed to the finals Saturday night.

The finals are slated to start at 6:30 p.m. and continue through the evening hours. Running events will not start until 7:30 p.m.

The top four finishers in each of the final field events and top six in each of the running events will qualify for the state track meet at Modesto, May 25.

Athletes competing at Cerritos this week will be the top six finishers from the Metropolitan, Western States, Eastern and Pacific Southwest conferences plus the event champions from the Desert Conference.

Sprint Cars Compete at Ascot Park

Bobby Hogle of Buena Park will shoot for his fifth CRA sprint car feature win of the year Saturday night at Gardena's Ascot Park. He meets a field of 50 of the West's top drivers in an eight event sprint car racing card.

Hogle will face five other drivers who have scored California Racing Association feature wins this year. They are Paul Jones of Torrance, Billy Wilkerson of El Monte, Carl Adams of El Cajon, Bob McCoy of San Diego and last Saturday night's main event winner, Ned Spoth of Ojai.

Hogle has two wins and two second place finishes to his credit at Ascot this year, plus two other CRA wins at other tracks. He will be behind the wheel of the three-time CRA championship winning Morales Bros. Offenhauser powered "Tamale Wagon" from Anaheim. The car has been driven to wins in the past by such speedway stars as Parnelli Jones, A. J. Foyt, Chuck Hulse, and Billy Vukovich.

Five Turbine Cars Scratched

At the Indianapolis Speedway, sound-proof turbine race cars continue to drown out piston engines as preparations intensify for the Memorial Day 500.

Andy Granatelli, president of STP, announced that No. 40, the pot-bellied turbocar that started last year by staging a runaway for 492 1/2 of the 500 miles, has been withdrawn from the race.

Turbine representation in the 500 is fast dwindling. Of the nine originally entered, five have been scratched. Last week Carroll Shelby withdrew his three GE-powered cars "for reasons of safety."

A brush with the wall Sunday left the STP car too badly damaged to make repairs "justified." Driver Joe Leonard was unhurt in the 166 m.p.h. crash after "hitting a helluva bump and losing control," said an STP spokesman in describing the accident.

The car, which was driven last year by Parnelli Jones is being trucked to Santa Monica, where it was built, and will be placed in permanent retirement.

"It will be reassembled as a museum piece," Granatelli said Monday. Rebuilding it is not justified since the car is not eligible to run after this year's race. It is not worth the expense in man hours.

Instead, Granatelli said his crews will devote their full time to the three remaining Lotus turbine cars. A fourth was destroyed last week in a crash that killed driver Mike Spence of England.

In addition, Granatelli lost the services Monday of another top driver, Jackie Stewart of Scotland. A wrist injury received in a European crash earlier this year has not responded to treatment sufficiently to permit the popular driver to handle one of the Lotus turbines as scheduled.

That leaves Granatelli with only two drivers for his three-car team—former world champion Graham Hill, the fastest man on the track to date at more than 169 m.p.h., and rookie Greg Weld. Leonard presumably will drive a Ford-powered car entered by Jones.

Some interesting speculation surrounded track record-holder Mario Andretti and a Lotus turbine after he took a spin in the car for the first time Sunday and averaged more than 167 m.p.h. Andretti officially has entered his own turbo-charged Ford in the race.

West High is scheduled to meet Rolling Hills in its first CIF playoff baseball game Friday. The game will be at Rolling Hills Field. The game matches Daryl Arenstein (8-0) of Rolling Hills against either Jim Mullens or Glen Males on the mound for West.

The game has the added attraction of two Pioneer League and Sky League opponents battling each other. Rolling Hills won the Sky League with a 11-4 record while West was second in the Pioneer race with a 9-6 record.

Rolling Hills has a veteran ball club, balanced with good pitching, fielding and hitting. West has not been overwhelming at the bat, but has relied on pitching strength.

SOUTH HIGH, winner of the Bay League, has virtually the same squad that won the American Legion state championship last summer.

The Spartans meet Freeway League runnerup Sunny Hills at home Friday afternoon. Dick Foulk, who fashioned a 7-2 record in the Bay League and finished the season with an 0.60 earned run average, and Wade Linstad, a 7-1 winner with an 1.71 ERA, give South a solid pitching combination.

The Spartans have beaucoup strength on the infield and outfield. Mike Hrehor, Jeff Wang and Steve Lehto are regulars, in the outfield and Dan Pace and Steve Shrader are at short and second.

Brent Barron, the power hitter last week, holds down first base. Steve Trudell, the regular third sacker, was used behind the plate last week, but Coach Jerry McIlwaine can also count on Glynn Winter for catching duty.

Roy Ricks is the alternate third sacker.

South won the Bay League a year ago, but lost to CIF champion Millikan in the first round of the playoffs.

INJURIES have sidelined North pitcher Bryan Smith (7-1), but Brad Rooker and Rick Delay have filled the gap. Also injured is first baseman Rick Creighton. Holding down first is Gary Prior.

North is particularly strong with Catcher Dave Skaggs, third baseman Art Frasquillo, and outfielder Royal Stillman.

Scott Bee, second baseman, led the Bay League in hitting with a .436 average.

North (13-5) finished one game behind South (14-4) in the Bay League standings.

The North Saxons travel to Bellflower Friday to battle the San Gabriel League champions in the first round.
