

## Lutheran Schoolchildren To Stage 'Rip Van Winkle'

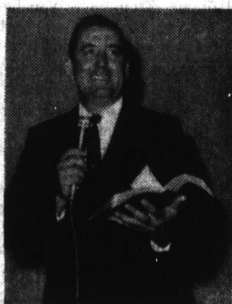
