## Compton Trustee In Bid for Seat

Dr. Walter R. Tucker, Democratic candidate for Congress in the 17th District said today he will return "local control of the Congressional District" if he is elected to Congress.

Dr. Tucker said he would use open and public Town Hall meetings in every neighborhood of the district to give constituents an opportunity to express their own concerns.

"It has been very informative to hear your opinions on matters of importance to our nation as a whole and our Congressional District in particular," Dr. Tucker commented. He said he arrived at his decision to use Town Hall meetings as a result of the many coffee hours he has attended during the past several weeks.

Dr. Tucker, a trustee of the Compton Union High

School District, said, "The next two years are sure to see many issues of very critical importance brought before the Congress of the United States. If chosen by you, the voters, I pledge to hold informal Town Hall meetings in the district whenever the need arises. These meetings will give you an opportunity to express your opinions and ideas on pending, as well as future, legislation."

Issues which are of most concern to voters, Dr. Tucker said, include restoration of harbor facilities, rapid transit, urban unrest, aid to senior citizens, parks and recreation, and education.

## Gibson Signs Ripped Down By Vandals

Louis Kanaster, general chairman of the John Gibson for Congress Committee, has sent a letter to his campaign volunteers asking them "not to respond in kind to one of our rival's tactics" in pulling down campaign signs.

A large number of Gibson campaign signs were destroyed in the 17th Congressional District in the past few days, he said, while posters for other candidates were apparently left untouched.
