South Bay Alumnae of the Gamma Phi Beta Sorority will hold its Fourth Annual Benefit Horse Show on Sunday, June 2, at the Empty Saddle Club in Rolling Hills Estates. Proceeds from the one-day show will go toward scholarships for graduating high school senior girls in the South Bay-Peninsula areas.

Spectators will have the opportunity of viewing "Two Horse Shows in One" this year. There are 13 Western classes, which will be judged in the Show Ring by Mr. William Harris, nationally recognized judge and trainer. Concurrently, 13 English classes will be judged in the Hunt Ring by Don Hurt, a well known judge throughout the United States.

The Show, open to junior and adult riders, is recognized by the Los Angeles County Horse Show Exhibitors Association and will attract riders and horses from Los Angeles and Orange counties. Approximately 150 riders will demonstrate their horsemanship while exhibiting their well trained

mounts in the 26 classes. The classes include English and Western Equitation, Hunters and Jumpers, and Trail and Pleasure horses.

First place winners will receive a Silver Trophy and ribbon with three-streamer ribbons being awarded through fifth place. Riders in the two respective divisions will compete for divisional awards. The high-point English rider will receive the H. W. Brunskill Perpetual Trophy (a silver punch bowl). The Western High Point Award will be awarded by Sherwin Trophies.

Spectators are invited to attend the show with no charge for admission. Refreshments will be available on the clubgrounds and there will be a special attraction during the intermission. Members of the Empty Saddle Club will provide a Cutting Horse Exhibition in the Show Ring. The members and their cutting horses will demonstrate the exciting action of the modern day "cowhorse" as the

horses perform with the Club's herd of cattle.

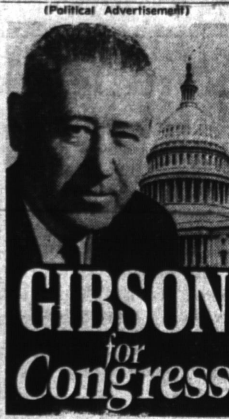
