

The Pep Boys, Manny Moe and Jack, today announced the three finalists in their 16th annual Four-Year Engineering Scholarship competition.

They are Walter J. McNulty, student at South Hills High School in West Covina; Ted E. Reynales, student at Millikan High School in Long Beach; and Raymond P. Robidoux, student at Savanna High School in Fullerton.

The engineering scholarship, providing tuition, books, and supplies for a four-year term, may be used at any state college or university. The scholarship contest was open to all high school seniors graduating in June, 1968.

TO QUALIFY for the competition, it was necessary to write an essay on traffic safety on the theme: "What I Would Do To Prevent Traffic Accidents and Save Lives." The three finalists received Bonds for writing the best trophies and U. S. Savings Bonds for writing the best essays.

SACRAMENTO — The Assembly Committee on Industrial Relations has held a lengthy hearing on AB-1377 by Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend (D-Torrance), the bill which would change the

method of publication of prevailing wage rates in bid advertising for public works projects, and taken the measure under submission.

Assemblyman Walter W. Powers (D-Sacramento), chairman of the committee, said the bill would be held under submission until a bill on the same subject comes over from

the Senate. That measure, by Senator John F. McCarthy (R-San Rafael), would abolish publication of the prevailing wage rates. It has been approved by the Senate Committee on Governmental Efficiency.

Townsend's bill, which has the support of the California Newspaper Publishers' Association, would require publication of the wage schedule

only twice. In addition, one publication of the schedule would be sufficient for all advertisements for bids in a single issue.

Ben Martin, general manager of CNPA, who appeared before the committee, said publication of advertisements, including the list of prevailing wage rates, is required as


The question has been before the legislature a number of times. Following disapproval of a bill by McCarthy last year, similar to his bill this year, the Industrial Relations Committee made an interim study. The CNPA proposed the change as carried in Townsend's bill.
