Civic Leader Resigns, Takes Post in Brazil

Theodore W. Paulson, manager of the Carson-Dominguez Industrial Council since October, 1965, has announced his resignation from that post to accept a position with Real Estate Research Corporation. Paulson will assume his new position on July 1, in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

As the first full-time manager of the Industrial Council, Paulson was responsible for the establishment of that organization as a permanent institution in the Dominguez-Carson area. The Industrial Council, under Paulson's management, has increased its membership to include forty-five of the leading concerns of the Dominguez-Carson industrial community.

Paulson's initial assignment with Real Estate Research Corporation will be to assist the Leo A. Daley Company and other firms who have been given the responsibility for the development of a master plan for the City of Sao Paulo, Brazil.
